## Suggested Pedagogical Processes **Learning Outcomes** The learner: The learner may be provided answers coherently in written or oral form in pairs / groups / opportunities to questions in English based on day-to-day individually and encouraged to: life experiences, unfamiliar story, poem > answers to text based questions, short heard or read. descriptive paragraphs orally as well as in recites and shares English, poems, games, writing. riddles, stories, tongue twisters etc. with > participates in activities which involve peers. English language use, such as role-play, acts according to instructions given in enactment, dialogue. English, in games/sports, such as 'Hit the looks at print-rich environment in sign ball!' 'Throw the ring.' 'Run to the finish boards, newspapers, comics, magazines etc line!'etc. prepares speech for morning assembly on stories reads simple in English selected topics independently, talks about it, and composes infers the meaning of unfamiliar words short paragraphs under guidance. from the context while reading a variety of uses meaningful grammatically correct texts.

- refers to the dictionary, for spelling, meaning of new words.
- understands the use of synonyms and antonyms.
- relates ideas and expressions in the stories that they have heard, to those in their mother tongue/surroundings/culturalcontext.
- reads independently and silently in English m o r a l stories, folk/fairy tales and current affairs.
- ➤ finds out different forms of writing lists, leave application, notice, invitation etc.
- ➤ learns grammar in a context and integrated manner (such as use of nouns, adverbs; differentiates between simple past and simple present verbs.)
- ➤ uses conjunctions between words and sentences such as 'and', 'but', etc.
- takes dictation of short texts such as lists and paragraphs.
- enriches vocabulary through crossword puzzles, word chains etc.
- looks at cartoons/ pictures/comic strips with or without words and speak/write a few sentences about them.

- sentences to describe and narrate incidents;
- uses synonyms such as 'fast/rapid', 'late/ early', and antonyms like happy/sad, long/short side, from clues in context
- reads text with comprehension, locates details and sequence of events.
- connects ideas that he/she has inferred, through reading and interaction, with his/her personal experiences.
- takes dictation for different purposes, such as lists, paragraphs, dialogues etc.
- uses dictionary
- writes paragraphs in English from verbal, visual clues, with appropriate punctuation marks and linkers.
- writes formal letters, notices and invitations.
- reads print in the surroundings (advertisements, directions, names of places etc),
- identifies kinds of nouns pronouns, verb, adjective, adverbs; differentiates between simple past and simple present verbs.
- (advertisements, directions, names of places etc), understands and answers queries
- attempts to write creatively (posters, etc)
- able to comprehend visual images.
- appreciates either verbally / in writing the variety in food, dress, festivals as read/heard in his/her day-to-day life/ in storybook
